Celebrate our ResTORAhtion

We will be studying and introducing some prophetic Scriptures today. Bible prophecy is one of the most interesting subjects and most controversial in many religious circles with their various interpretation of what is to come (Hebrew : Olam Haba). Understanding prophecy is part of our foundation in the messianic belief system. As we have been stressing the whole time and the Torah with all of its instructions in the return of the Messiah (Messiah Ben David) certainly His coming is of prophetic significant proportions and we believe that with our whole heart.

We will examine two prophetic Scriptures that powerfully summarize the main themes of what the Torah (the Bible) is teaching us in appreciation to the foundational roots, to return us to a proper relationship with the Land of Israel, the People, and the Scriptures of Israel.

1. Our Return to the Lord (Deuteronomy 30:1-2)

The physical descendants of Avraham, Yitzchak and Yaacov will return to Him . Salvation will come to the remnant of Israel and the nations. (Deut 30:6) God will circumcise the hearts! (Colossians 2:11-12)

2. Our Return to the Land (Deuteronomy 30:3-5)

Israel in its history after the destruction of the temple in 70 AD and after a series of captivity starting from the Roman Empire. Mark Twain's visit in Israel in 1867 said of it that "it was a wasteland." Read Deuteronomy 29:22-26 also Deuteronomy 30:7-9.

3. Our Return to the Covenant Promises (Deuteronomy 30:6-14)

Returning by God's people in keeping the Covenant of Torah to begin walking out in celebrating their divine inheritance.

4. Our Redemption (Zechariah 8)

The prophetic return of the redeemed non-Jewish believers (8:20-23). These believers will "Take Hold" of Jewish believers who are Torah keeping and observant to learn of their biblical Jewish and Hebraic foundations of the Bible (Torah) to gain a deeper, more intimate understanding of God and his laws.

In Closing:

Ultimately, all believers in Yeshua Messiah (Jew or non-Jew) share the same inheritance.

Spiritually we share the inheritance of Salvation (of Eternal life).

Physically, we will inherit a portion of the Land as a "son" of Abraham and share in God's promises to him (Genesis 12:2-3)
